Overcoming Obstacles the JobTrain Way



In 2015, Danica immigrated to the United States from the Philippines. She had a high school diploma and three years of college, but without job skills and experience here in the United States, it was very difficult for Danica to find a good job. Eventually, she found a job at a local retailer, but was still not earning a livable wage. Danica heard about JobTrain from a co-worker and enrolled in the Medical Assistant class in July 2016.

Danica worked hard and learned quickly. Her Medical Assistant instructor, Hayam, said of her: "When Danica first came to class, she was shy. Even though her English was very good, she was unsure of her language skills. As the class progressed and participated in mock interviews and other trainings, she gained more confidence." In February 2017, Danica graduated from the Medical Assistant class. It was a very proud moment for her. Hayam noted: "Because she was one of the highest ranked students in her class, we placed her at an externship at Stanford in March 2017. She excelled at her externship and is now working full-time at Stanford as a Clinical Medical Assistant. She is earning a good wage, and her supervisor is very pleased with her work."

Danica is just one example of how JobTrain graduates are workforce ready, with the skills needed to help businesses be successful. Equally impressive about JobTrain graduates, is that many, like Danica, have had to overcome various obstacles to get where they are today, but these challenges have only made them more determined to succeed! Danica's story illustrates how gaining the right job skills, combined with personal motivation and determination, leads to success on the job.

It seems appropriate to let Danica's supervisor at Stanford have the last word here: "Danica takes initiative. She understands documentation of patient records, and takes her time to understand patient needs. She is willing to learn new things and is a quick learner. Danica is a hard worker, a team player, and a wonderful person to work with."

Message from the President & CEO: The Data Is In

One of the most vexing challenges we face in the non-profit sector is staying connected with program participants so we can track, measure, and evaluate the long-term impact of our work. Longitudinal impact evaluation is vitally important in our mission to help very low income people achieve sustainable, upward economic mobility.

For the first time, thanks to a partnership with the Tipping Point Community Foundation and EDD (Employment Development Department), we have access to long-term earnings data for JobTrain graduates. In April, JobTrain received employment and earnings data (from EDD) for all graduates from 2005 through 2017, and the results are very affirming. While we still have a lot to glean from this data, I'm excited to share some highlights.

The most striking and promising outcome is JobTrain's alumni experience sustained wage growth year over year post graduation. For example, average earnings for students graduating in 2005 were \$13,000 per year. For this same group of graduates, average earnings in 2016 were \$44,000 per year, with the top 10 percent earning an average of \$98,000. This data proves that we are fulfilling our core mission

and our stakeholders are seeing a strong social and economic return on their investment.

The data also reflects some very interesting trends including wages and employment based on educational level, gender, ethnicity, age, incarceration status and more. JobTrain is committed to continuous improvement of programs, serving clients with more profound barriers to employment, and focusing on relevant career pathways. This longitudinal, comprehensive data proves what we have believed all along, that our programs are working, at the same time providing insights into programmatic aspects that we can improve. I look forward to sharing the full report of our findings and our proposed responses to the challenges.


