"Don't give up, you can do it" are some of their words of advice to those students following behind them. This holiday season we ask for your support to help more people ring the bell at JobTrain and transform their lives. Since 1965 JobTrain has been creating pathways from poverty to economic mobility, empowering low-income people to move from unemployment to sustainable careers. JobTrain serves more than 1,000 individuals each year with Career Trainings, Skills Upgrade trainings, and Job Placement services. Overall, about 2,500 individuals benefit from a JobTrain program or service every year.

JobTrain's programs work: over 81% of graduates obtained a job in FY19, and 87% of those placed in a job are still working one year later, and many have been promoted. These impressive outcomes illustrate that our "whole person" approach of combining career skills, academics, essential skills and support services leads to success.

Everyone - regardless of age, immigration status, or criminal history - needs to be counted.

An undercount of our population could affect services to families and children, planning for public schools, transportation, or hospitals.
