I heard about JobTrain from my sister-in-law who was celebrating her graduation from JobTrain as a Medical Assistant. I was shocked because I had been taking classes to be an MA before her and she was already done. I decided to enroll in JobTrain and prayed to God I would get in. It was incredibly exciting to receive the news of my acceptance into the March 2020 cohort.

I decided to be in the Medical Assistant field because it is one of the most stable careers available. It's a job I will enjoy waking up to and know that my family is proud of me. My daughter has someone to look up to, and she will know that the sky's the limit for her.




