WORKFORCE AND HOUSING WORKING TOGETHER



Sometimes, one small step is all it takes to make a giant leap in life. That was the case for Maria, a grocery store bagger at Safeway. One day, her manager noticed her speaking English, and translating for other staff. Impressed by her initiative and potential, Maria's manager promoted her and today she happily runs the store's meat department. Maria credits her recent success to the ESL program she enrolled in through a partnership between JobTrain and MidPen Housing.

The JobTrain/MidPen Housing partnership serves underemployed individuals in need of affordable housing by focusing on skills that can enable their economic mobility. Courses include learning to speak English, computer basics and technology, and getting a GED. Participants earn a stipend while they continue to learn and progress through each discipline.

This Learn-and-Earn model promotes trust and encourages professional development and participation. It's a pathway to economic mobility.

After completing ESL level 1, Maria enrolled in the next course for level 2 to improve her English. Her instructor was impressed to see Maria's dedication to improving her English and for going above and beyond to help other students in the class. One of those students was Mireya who works two jobs as a house cleaner and gardener. Mireya used to just say "Okay" without understanding. Since learning to speak English, she has impressed her program coordinator by assisting with administrative tasks including helping to fill out surveys in English for clients. Mireya is now more comfortable helping her kids with school assignments.

Assisting the North Fair Oaks Community

JobTrain's North Fair Oaks Career Center has quickly embedded itself in the community. Recently, a client who only spoke Spanish with irregular house cleaning jobs sought the help of the Center's employment specialists. Her husband was diagnosed with cancer and unable to work, which meant she had to become the sole breadwinner and find more stable employment. Staff sprang into action helping her create a resume, canvass the job market, and prepare for interview questions. Determination and commitment paid off. She secured a full-time janitorial job with the County of San Mateo, earning a living wage with health benefits and consistent hours. The Career Center staff proudly serves its community.



I.T. Alumni Meet Up

Diploma Faleta (pictured left) speaks to JobTrain alumni of the I.T. Support and Services training program. Diploma successfully completed his I.T. Support and Services training at JobTrain in the fall of 2019 and took on contract jobs for two years. Diploma said, "You have to learn as much as you can with every opportunity that comes your way. Don't be afraid to ask questions. And you must never give up." Diploma's commitment, hard work, and positive attitude eventually earned him a permanent position as an employee at Nvidia. A participant commented, "This event was super helpful and gave me courage! I am connected to resources."
