At first, he doubted himself. But day after day, he showed up. He put in the work, learned new skills, and discovered a renewed sense of purpose. Today, Jonathan is earning \$32 an hour, supporting himself,

rebuilding his life, and inspiring others in his community to believe in what's possible.

Jonathan reminds us that potential is always there, waiting for the right opportunity to come alive. That's what JobTrain is all about — creating the conditions where people can step into their power, write their own story, and move toward a future of economic mobility.

This year, as we prepare to expand into a new training center, we are building even more doorways, and places where people like Jonathan can transform their lives.

## From Scrubs to Strength

With belief, determination, and support, Bryan turned long nights and hard commutes into a new career path.

SOMETIMES, all it takes is a spark. For Bryan, that spark came unexpectedly during a routine clinical visit.

Bryan, the graduate speaker at JobTrain's Medical Assistant training program, related how a young Medical Assistant at the clinic changed the course of his life. The Medical Assistant told Bryan of the opportunity he had at JobTrain. That story lit something in Bryan.

"It made me realize that the opportunities were out there, and all I had to do was just find the

courage to grab on and never let go."

Before that moment, Bryan had been stuck in a string of dead-end jobs, working hard but going nowhere. He dreamed of making his parents proud by building a life that felt meaningful, but he didn't know how to begin.

What followed was not easy. Bryan worked full-time in Daly City, commuting to Menlo Park each night. The days were long, the highway unforgiving. "I'd change into my scrubs in a utility closet at work," he recalled. "I felt like Superman, only without the cape and instead a set of wrinkled scrubs."

But inside that classroom, something sacred was unfolding.

Bryan told his instructor, Ms. K, "You didn't just teach us how to take vitals, you taught us how to carry ourselves with competence and compassion. You never made us feel small for our mistakes. You believed in us, even on our bad days."

And then there was his Career Development Specialist, Layal, who provided professional development. She was a formidable presence with

an unwavering sense of purpose.

"You were the kind of tough we didn't ask for, but ended up grateful for," said Bryan. "You saw more in us than we saw in ourselves. You held us to our highest potential and never let us settle for less."

Students like Bryan don't just graduate with skills, they walk away with confidence, clarity, and the power to

dream again. That transformation isn't accidental. It's the result of staff who see beyond barriers, who believe fiercely in potential, even when students can't yet see it themselves.

And it's because of donors like you that the sparks keep igniting. Because when belief meets hope, lives don't just change, they radiate.
